

- At the mini-roundabout/Buttermarket in Barnard Castle turn left down the hill and follow the road over the bridge crossing the river Tees and bear right
- Follow the road out of Barnard Castle (with the river running on your right-hand side)
- Continue for a few miles passing through the village of Lartington, then Cotherstone and then you arrive at Romalldkirk

**STOP POINT** - Take the right turning in Romalldkirk and you will see the Rose & Crown which is under the same ownership as Headlam Hall and a great place for food and drink (If planning lunch booking is strongly advised)

- Continue through Romalldkirk passing the church on your left-hand side and out of the village
- At the T junction turn right down to the bridge crossing the river Tees
- Follow the road up the other side and at the T junction turn right (signposted Stanhope/Barnard Castle)
- Follow this road going up the steep hill (thanks for electric bikes!) and at the top of the hill miss the first left
- Take the second left turning (signposted Bishop Auckland/Staindrop)
- Follow this road down the dale for a good 4-5 miles to Staindrop
- At the junction bear left through the village and round the left-hand bend at the church
- About 75 yards after the bend take the right turning (signposted Darlington)
- Follow this road for a few miles to Ingleton
- After passing through Ingleton take the right turning (signposted Gainford)
- Miss the first little left and take the next left (signposted Headlam)
- Bear left at the junction and back down into Headlam

# HIRE AN ELECTRIC BIKE

With a battery range of around 50 miles these e-bikes are a relaxing and fun way to explore the surrounding countryside on two wheels with the powerful electric motor making easy work of hills.

We have suggested routes depending on how far you want to go with some recommended 'refreshment' stops!

**Full day hire rate (10am-6pm):**  
**£50 per bike**

**Half day hire rate (10am-1pm or 3pm-6pm):**  
**£35 per bike**

## ROUTE 1 NORTH YORKSHIRE VILLAGES

*Approx. 25 miles so ideal for a 3 hour hire  
with stops*

- Turn left at the end of the hotel drive
- At the top of the hill keep right (straight on)
- At the T junction turn right
- Take your first left into Langton
- Take your next left in the village (down a hill)
- Follow this road for a couple of miles going past the ford/bridge (the bridge is the safer option!)
- At the T junction turn left
- When you get to the T junction at the main road turn right and then left into Winston
- In the middle of Winston turn left down the hill to cross the river Tees (signposted Ovington/Richmond)
- Follow this road for about 1 mile and take next left turn (signposted Eppleby 2)
- Follow this lane for 2 miles and when you arrive at the T junction turn right into Eppleby

**STOP POINT** - At the end of the village green there is a small shop/tearoom which is popular with cyclists

- Continue on the road to the end of Eppleby and take your next left (signposted Forcett/Stanwick)
- Miss the next left turn and then at the T junction (looking at the entrance to Forcett Hall) turn left
- Follow this road for a couple of miles and take the next left (signposted Melsonby/Aldbrough)
- Follow this road until you get to Melsonby and in the middle of the village at the crossroads turn left (signposted Aldbrough)
- Follow this road until you get to Aldbrough, continue through the village and out the other side
- When you get to the T junction at the main road turn left (signposted Piercebridge)
- When you get to Piercebridge cross the river Tees

**STOP POINT** - Choose between the Organic Farm café on the left of the village green or when you get to the T junction there is a nice pub called the Fox Hole

- Go left at the Fox Hole and then left again onto the A67
- After about a ¼ mile take the right turning (signposted Headlam Hall)
- Follow this road for 2-3 miles and take the right turn back into Headlam

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## ROUTE 2 TOUR OF TEESDALE

*Approx. 40 miles so a good day out with stops*

- Turn left at the end of the hotel drive
- At the top of the hill keep right (straight on)
- At the T junction turn right
- Take your first left into Langton
- Take your next left in the village (down a hill)
- Follow this road for a couple of miles going past the ford/bridge (the bridge is the safer option!)
- At the T junction turn left
- Take the first right on the outside of the left-hand bend (signposted Newsham/South Cleatham)
- At the end of this lane at the T junction turn left
- Continue through Little Newsham and about ½ mile after the village fork right
- At the crossroads with the main road go straight ahead
- Follow the road down to Whorlton and take the right turning in the village (signposted Barnard Castle)
- Follow the road until you get to Barnard Castle passing the Bowes Museum on your right

**STOP POINT** - There is a café at the Bowes Museum or a number of options in the centre of town
